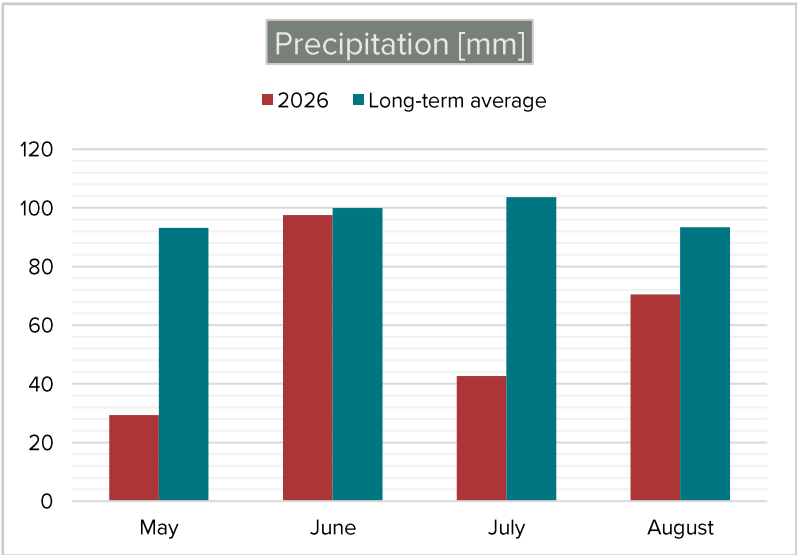
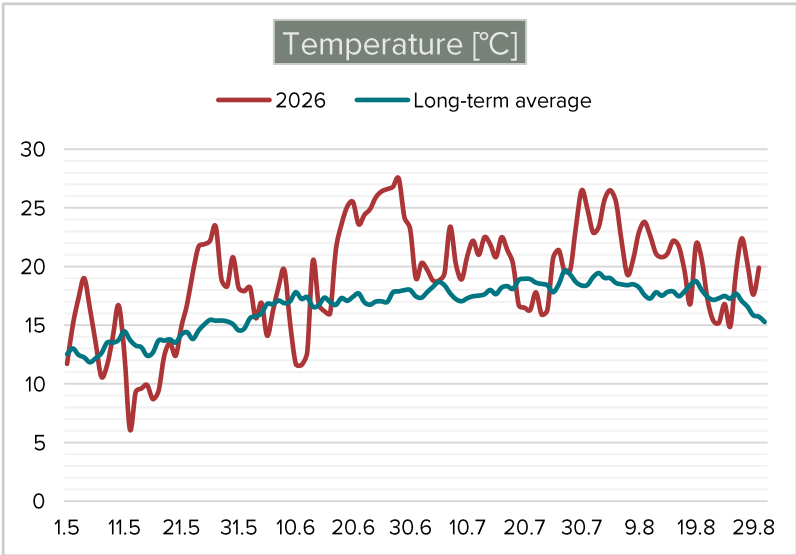
Comments

In the Hallertau region, the weather has been changeable in recent weeks, which has favored the ripening of the crops. With an estimated total yield of 29,390 metric tons, a below-average crop is expected. Due to the hot and dry weather, as well as the reduction in acreage, yield losses of about 21% compared to last year are anticipated. Due to low disease and pest pressure, good quality is expected, albeit with low alpha values. Harvesting is set to begin in the coming days.

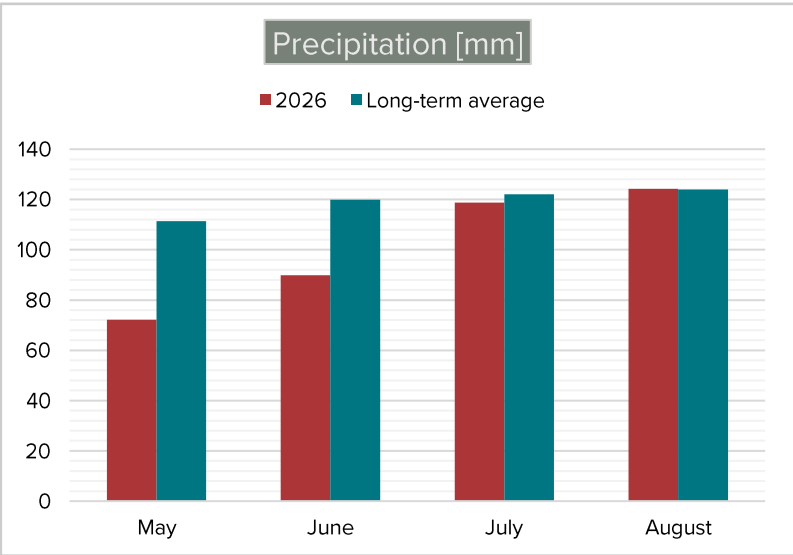
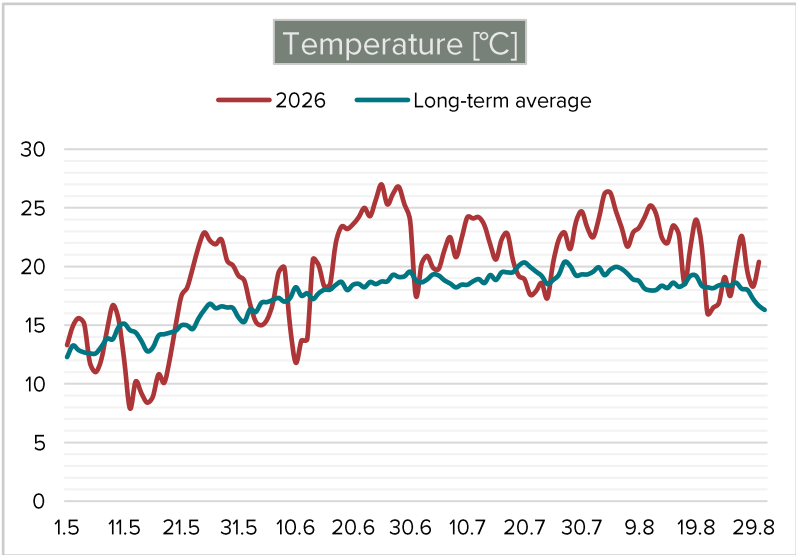
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Comments

In Tett nang, the harvest is already in full swing. The yield is estimated at 2,379 metric tons, which is 13% lower than last year. Even in this usually rainy region, this is due to the significant lack of precipitation, as well as high temperatures, which have a particularly negative impact on the land varieties (TET, HAL).

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Comments

In the Elbe-Saale region, growing conditions were somewhat more favorable from May through August. Also due to the large proportion of irrigated hop fields, yield losses are expected to be only about 10 percent. This is mainly due to the reduction in acreage. The crop volume is estimated at 2,248 metric tons. Harvesting is expected to begin toward the end of this week.
